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Special Issues of Journals

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The Maghreb Review dedicates the second issue of volume 43 (2018) to Islamic Philosophy. Mohammad Azadpur is the editor. Articles by Michael Nafi, Mohammad Azadpur, Sajjad Rizvi and Fitzroy Morrissey. It includes a very selected bibliography of books on pp. 198-202.

Mélanges de l'Université Saint-Joseph dedicates a section of its vol. 68 (2017-2018) to The Reception of Classical Arabic Philosophy in the Ottoman Empire with articles by C. D'Ancona, N. Zouggar, R.P. Ansari, A. Bertolacci, G. Celli, S. Di Vincenzo, Ch. Genequand & T. Morel, and M.S. Özervarli. It focuses another section on new discoveries in the Syriac and Arabic Manuscripts with articles by Z. Bou Akl, S. Di Vincenzo, J. Jabbour, M.C. Kaya, St. Di Pietrantonio and T. Morel.

MIDÉO, Mélanges de l'Institut dominicain d'études orientales, Cairo, dedicates most of its vol. 33 (2018) to the Muslim Theology of Religions. Articles by A.-S. Boisliveau, D. Thomas, E. Pisani, G. Jenvrin, G. de Vault d'Arcy & M. Terrier.

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Oriens dedicates vol. 46, issues 1-2, to Rationalist Disciplines and Postclassical Islamic Legal Theories, ed. by Asad Q. Ahmed & Robert Gleave. This issue shows the close connection between logic and *fiqh*. Articles by C.S. El-Tobgui, W.E. Young, A.Q. Ahmed, O. Farahat, N. Kalbarczyk.

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New Series

Arabo-Islamica is edited by Maribel Fierro with Hassan Ansari, Julia Bray, Khaled El-Rouaybeh, Sebastian Günter & Verena Klemm. It is published by Cordoba University Press in cooperation with the Cordoba Near Eastern Unit and The Princeton Institute for Advanced Study. The first volume should come out in 2018.
