Pavlos Kontos is Professor of Philosophy at the University of Patras, Greece. He has been a Visiting Professor at various places and, notably, at the University of Freiburg (as a Humboldt-Fellow) and at UNC at Chapel Hill. He is the 2017-2018 W. J. Bouwsma Fellow at the *National Humanities Center*, NC.

Kontos has extensively published on phenomenology and on Aristotle's ethics.
