Why I Teach Thomas Aquinas at Peking University

Professor of Ancient and Medieval Philosophy at Peking University

Born into a family of medical doctors, Dr. Tianyue Wu forged his own path by choosing to study philosophy. Interested in questions of faith and the afterlife (not mainstream topics of investigation in China), he decided that that doctors for the soul are far more important than doctors for the body. In his talk he will tell us what Thomas Aquinas has to offer to the intellectual elite of China he is teaching at Peking University. The talk presupposes no philosophical knowledge.
